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Town of Salzburg – A UNESCO World Heritage Site

The unmistakable cityscape of Salzburg and its numerous cultural monuments led UNESCO to designate the Old Town as a World Heritage Site in 1979. Salzburg is considered one of the most exquisite Baroque cities north of the Alps. Its skyline defined by the imposing Hohen Salzburg Fortress, the cathedral, and the city's elegant Baroque spires. The grand squares and narrow alleys, the prince-archbishops' residence, churches, monasteries, and cemeteries, as well as the Mirabell Gardens and the historic arcaded houses of the Getreidegasse, all contribute to its inimitable charm—conveniently accessible on foot.



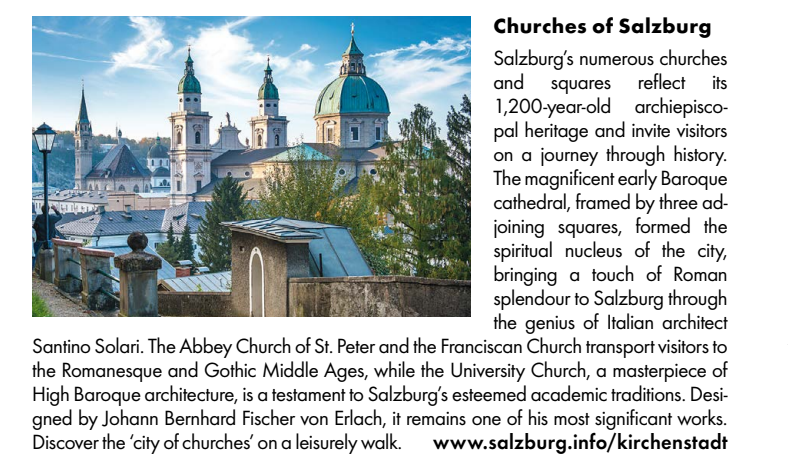
Hohen Salzburg Fortress

Constructed in 1077 under Archbishop Gebhard and eventually expanded by Archbishop Leonhard von Keutschach (1495–1519), Hohen Salzburg Fortress stands as the largest fully preserved castle in Central Europe and an enduring landmark of the Mozart town. Particularly noteworthy are the opulent state rooms (Garden Hall, Golden Chamber, and the prince-archbishops' bedroom) within the main castle, which include the captivating Magic Theatre. Visitors will also delight in the romantic castle courtyards and the fortress museums (Fortress Museum, Majoratene Museum, Rainer Museum, and the old armoury). Since 1892, the fortress has been effortlessly accessible via Austria's oldest funicular railway from Festungsgasse.



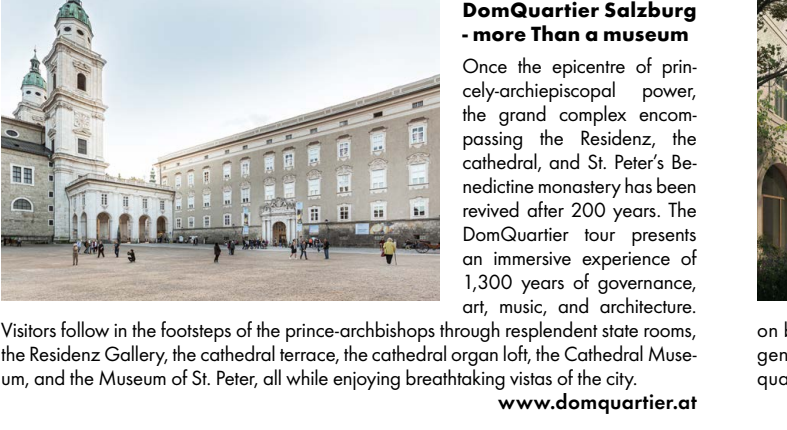
Churches of Salzburg

Salzburg's numerous churches and squares reflect its 1,200-year-old archiepiscopal heritage and invite visitors on a journey through history. The magnificent early Baroque cathedral, first formed by three adjoining squares, formed the spiritual nucleus of the city, bringing a touch of Roman splendour to Salzburg through the genius of Italian architect Santino Solari. The Abbey Church of St. Peter and the Franciscan Church transport visitors to Salzburg's Catholic Middle Ages, while the University Church of High Baroque architecture, is a testament to Salzburg's esteemed academic traditions. Designed by Johann Bernhard Fischer von Erlach, it remains one of his most significant works. Discover the City of Churches on a leisurely walk.



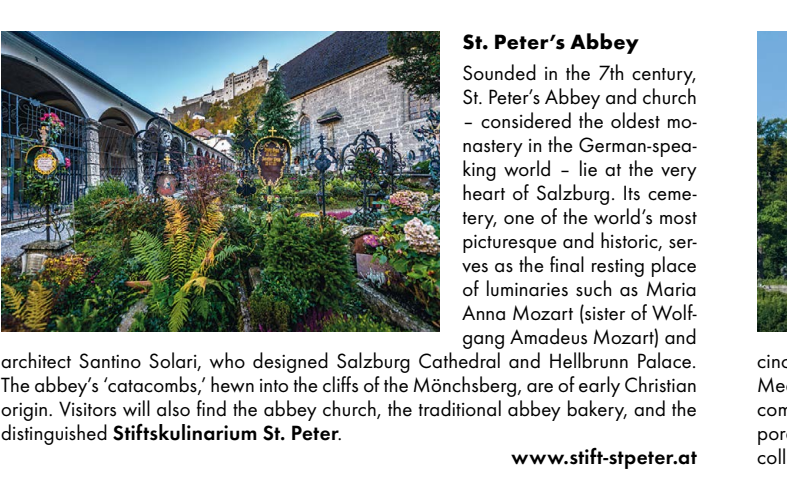
DomQuartier Salzburg – more than a museum

Once the epicentre of princely-archiepiscopal power, the DomQuartier complex encompassing the Residence, the cathedral, and St. Peter's Benedictine monastery has been revived after 200 years. The DomQuartier tour presents an immersive experience of 1,300 years of governance, art, music, and architecture.



St. Peter's Abbey

Sounded in the 7th century, St. Peter's Abbey and church – considered the oldest monastery in the German-speaking world – lie at the very heart of Salzburg. Its cemetery, one of the world's most picturesque and historic, serves as the final resting place of luminaries such as Maria Anna Mozart (sister of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart) and architect Santino Solari, who designed Salzburg Cathedral and Hellbrunn Palace. The abbey's 'caveats', heaven into the cliffs of the Mönchsberg, are of early Christian origin. Visitors will also find the abbey church, the traditional abbey bakery, and the distinguished Stiftskulinarium St. Peter.



Mozartplatz

At the heart of this square stands the **Mozart Monument**, sculpted by Ludwig Schwanthaler and unveiled in 1842 in the presence of Mozart's sons. Sadly, his widow, Constanze von Wessely, did not live to witness the occasion. During excavation works, a remarkable Roman mosaic floor was discovered, inscribed with the words: hic habitat [felicitas], nihil iniret mal [Here dwells [happiness], let no evil enter]. Nearby, at the Schaller House on Wasengasse, the poet Georg Trakl was born. Opposite, the **Salzburg Christmas Museum** offers a festive experience, while behind it stands **St. Michael's Church**, the city's oldest surviving church.



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The Great Festival Hall (Großes Festspielhaus), designed by architect Clemens Holzmeister, ranks among the world's largest concert halls. The architectural complex on Hofgasse, encompassing the Great Festival Hall, the House for Mozart, and the Felsenreitschule, traces its origins to stables built by Archbishop Wolf Dietrich in 1606/07. Opened for the Salzburg Festival in 1925, the venue has since been a world of art, theatre, and the renowned Salzburg Festival.

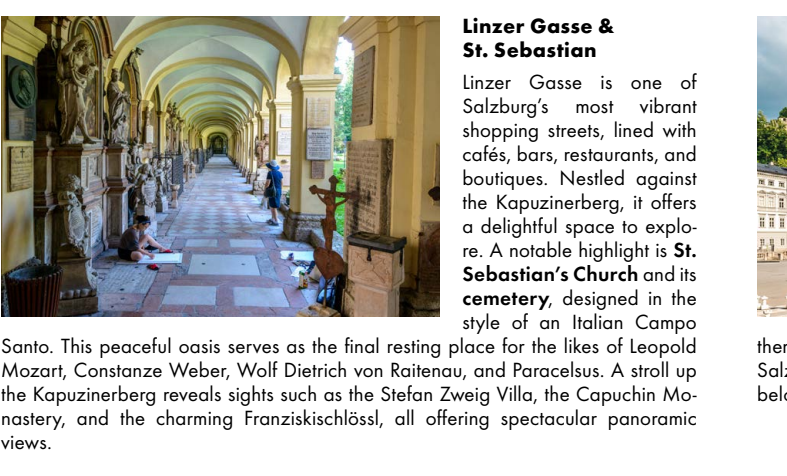
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Shopping

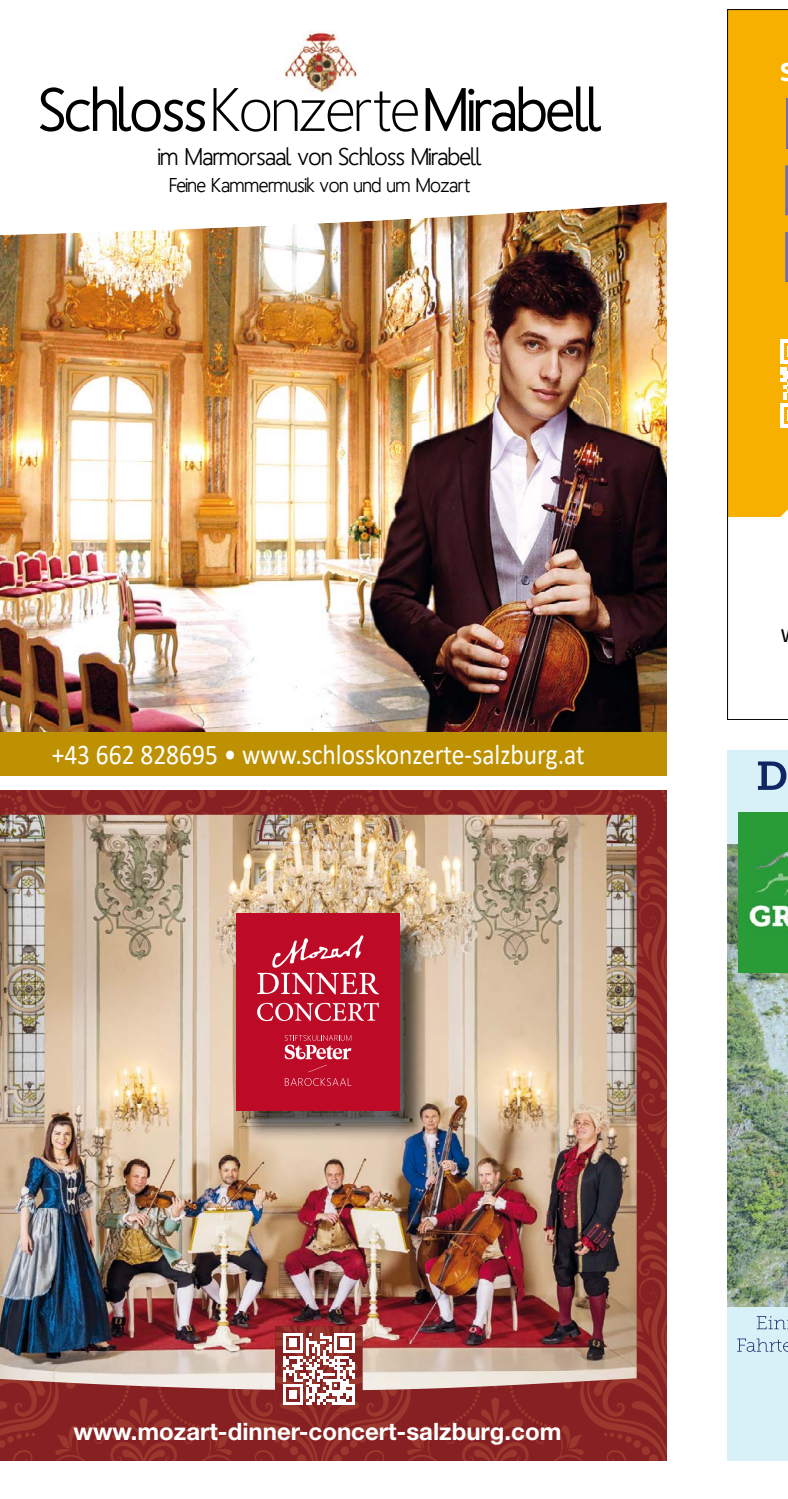

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Mozart's Birthplace

In Getreidegasse 9, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart was born on 27 January 1756. The Mozart family resided here from 1747 to 1773. Today, the family apartment is a museum, showcasing famous exhibits such as Mozart's childhood violin, original manuscripts, authentic portraits, and personal letters, alongside original furnishings. Getreidegasse itself is the vibrant heart of Salzburg's most charming shopping street, lined with elaborate wrought-iron gold signs, ornate portals, passageways, and picturesque arcaded courtyards.

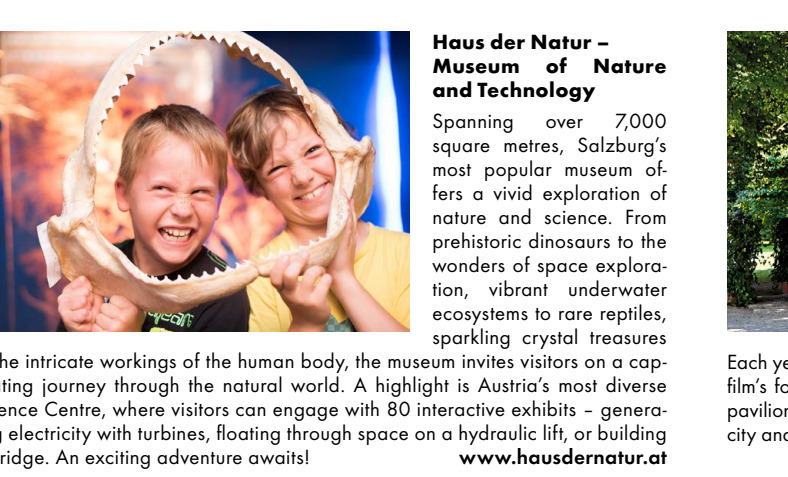
Mozart Residence

This house, first documented in 1617 and located at Marktplatz 8, was home to Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart from 1747 to 1773. The former apartment on the first floor has been transformed into a museum that chronicles the history of the house and the life of the Mozart family. Visitors can view original musical instruments, such as the fortepiano and violin, as well as the famous family portrait in the 'Janzmeisteraal'.



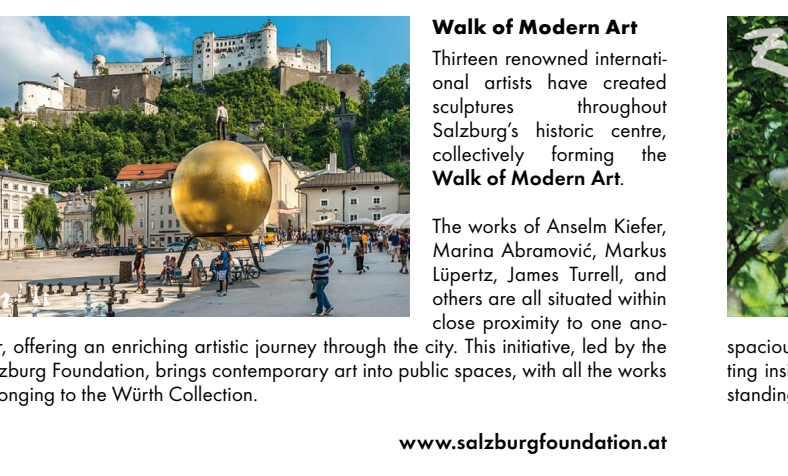
Mirabell Gardens

A magnet for visitors, Mirabell Gardens is famed for its exquisite fountains, sculptures, whimsical Dwarf Garden, and the enchanting Hedge Theatre, which hosts performances. Built in 1606 by Archbishop Wolf Dietrich von Rottenau, the gardens, known as the 'Mirabell Palace', are a masterpiece of Baroque garden design. Haus der Natur – Museum of Nature and Technology

Spanning over 7,000 square metres, Haus der Natur, the most popular museum in Salzburg, offers a vivid exploration of nature and science. From prehistoric dinosaurs to the wonders of space exploration, vibrant underwater ecosystems to rare reptiles, sparkling crystal treasures to the intricate workings of the human body, the museum invites visitors on a captivating journey through the natural world. A highlight is Austria's most diverse Science Centre, where visitors can engage with 80 interactive exhibits – generating electricity with turbines, blowing through space on a hydraulic lift, or building a bridge. An exciting adventure awaits!



Walk of Modern Art

Thirteen renowned international artists have created sculptures throughout Salzburg's historic centre, collectively forming the Walk of Modern Art. The works of Anselm Kiefer, Marina Abramović, Markus Lupertz, James Turrell, and others are all situated within close proximity to one another, offering an enriching artistic journey through the city. This initiative, led by the Salzburg Foundation, brings contemporary art into public spaces, with all the works belonging to the Würth Collection.

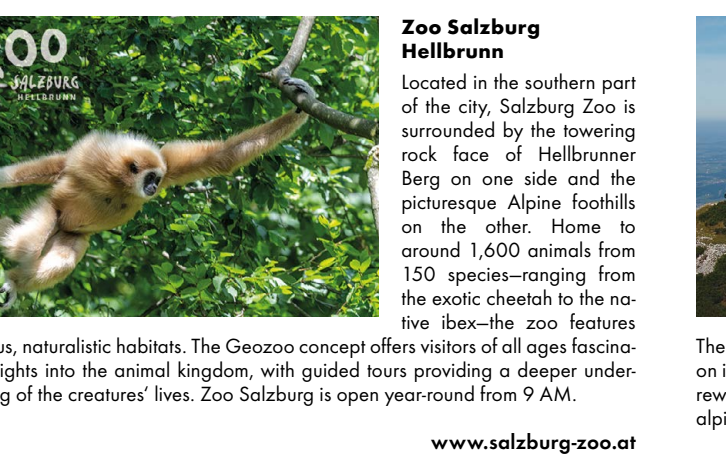
The Sound of Music

The 'Singing Trapp Family' from Salzburg was among the most successful choirs in the United States during the 1950s, serving as cultural ambassadors for Austria. Interest in their story soared following the 1965 film adaptation of the musical, starring Julie Andrews and Christopher Plummer, which won five Academy Awards.



Zoo Salzburg Hellbrunn

Located in the southern part of the city, Zoo Salzburg is surrounded by the towering rock face of Hellbrunn Berg on one side and the picturesque Alpine foothills on the other. Home to around 1,600 animals from 150 species—ranging from the exotic cheetah to the native ibex—the zoo features spacious, naturalistic habitats. The Geozoo concept offers visitors of all ages fascinating insights into the animal kingdom, with guided tours providing a deeper understanding of the creatures' lives. Zoo Salzburg is open year-round from 9 AM.

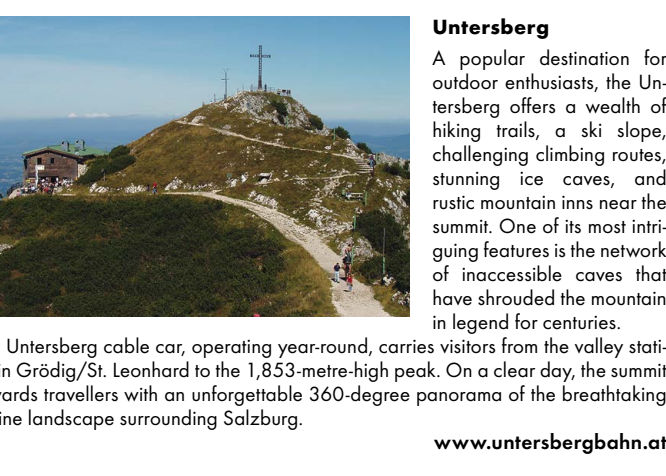
Salzburger Open-Air Museum

Located at the foot of Untersberg, in the neighbouring village of Grödig, this 50-hectare museum lies within the protected landscape area surrounding the mountain. It houses over 100 original historic buildings, offering a fascinating glimpse into agriculture, craftsmanship, trade, and industry. A 7-kilometre network of walking and hiking trails links more than 600 years of rural history, while the 2-kilometre stretch of the historic museum railway takes visitors through large sections of the museum grounds. Visitors can also enjoy the cosy Salt town, with a spacious beer garden and its own railway stop, ensuring a delightful culinary experience.



Hanger-7

Originally conceived to house the ever-expanding collection of historic aircraft from The Flying Bulls, Hanger-7 has since become synonymous with avant-garde architecture, contemporary art, and an exquisite food and drink offering. Its unique combination makes it one of the region's most dynamic attractions. The changing light streaming through the glass dome creates a constantly shifting atmosphere, offering a new ambience by day and by night. This unique mood is best enjoyed with a coffee, a meal from top chefs, or a cocktail. Visitors can explore the exhibits and artworks daily, free of charge.
