



## Cycling close to Salzburg

### Biking on the outskirts of Salzburg

Salzburg is an absolute paradise for all cyclists. Whether on a touring-, mountain-, E-, or road bike – in the towns and villages just outside Salzburg, you will find ideal starting points for short outings or extended excursions, into the city of Mozart or out across beautiful Salzburger Land. Here is a small selection:

### Tauernradweg

Where the highest waterfalls in Central Europe - Krimml Waterfalls - plunge thunderously into the depths below, you will also find the start of the Tauernradweg, one of the most popular long-distance bike tours in the Alps.

## Hiking close to Salzburg

## Memorable experiences in and around the city of Mozart!

A holiday in Salzburg is attractive in so many different ways, not just because of the countless art and cultural treasures in and close to the city. For 85 % off all summer visitors, in fact, hiking is the focus of their interest. The communities just outside Salzburg are ideal starting points for some truly great hikes.

### Exploring nature with hiking poles

Rookie hikers are just as likely to find suitable routes as are trail-hardened pros: The hikes range from one to 25 km in length and lead through natural landscapes that teem with variety. Naturally, these same beautiful trails are also perfect for running or walking! Every community on the outskirts of Salzburg offers attractive hiking opportunities, with precise details available from the local tourist offices.

The easy hikes across the city mountains of Salzburg itself are also highly recommended. The Kapuzinerberg as well as the Mönchsberg both feature beautiful routes that anyone can manage easily, accompanied by truly wonderful views of the historic district and surrounding countryside.

## Hiking on the Untersberg

### It is majestic and mystic: Numerous legends are interwoven with the Untersberg, at the foot of which lies Grödig.

From St. Leonhard bei Grödig, the Untersberg gondola floats up to the Geiereck at 1805 m (this lift ride is included with the Salzburg Card!). In clear visibility, you are treated to unforgettable 360° views across Rosittental out to the Salzkammergut, along with the peaks of the Hohe Tauern, Tennen- and Hagengebirge ranges.

The highest point on the Austrian side of the mountain is the Salzburger Hochthron (1853 m). This mountain of mystery and overwhelming natural power offers many hiking routes, fixed-cable climbing tours and even the opportunity to explore the mysterious Schellenberger ice cave.

Winter sports fans are also able to use the Untersbergbahn to get up the mountain. A walk of just 15 minutes then brings them from the Untersbergbahn mountain terminal to the 7.5 km long valley ski run, dropping all the way back down to Fürstenbrunn. From there, the No. 35 bus provides regular service back to the valley station.

Just a little farther afield and you will discover countless other attractive offers for hikers – the Salzkammergut as well as surrounding mountain regions are just a short drive away.

# Bathing enjoyment in and around Salzburg

For pleasant swimming experiences in every season, Salzburg and its surrounding communities offer a wide selection of modern pools and crystal-clear lakes.

### **Paracelsus Bad**

Salzburg's most modern pool facility promises bathing enjoyment for all. A 25 m lap pool, a diving pool with climbing wall, a waterslide, a family pool with water attractions along with a toddler pool promise unforgettable moments in and around the water.

### Freibad Leopoldskron – Lepi

Freibad Leopoldskron is an outdoor recreational facility opened in the mid-1960s. In a green setting spanning more than 53,000 m<sup>2</sup>, it has undergone continuous modernization and is now one of the top swimming attractions in the area.

### Freibad Volksgarten

An outdoor pool complex of roughly 1500 m<sup>2</sup> on grounds that are almost 13,000 m<sup>2</sup> in total area. The swimming facilities include two big pools, a smaller 45 m<sup>2</sup> pool for children and a 12 m<sup>2</sup> paddling pool for the littlest kids.

### Freibad Alpenstraße – AYA Bad

Freibad Alpenstraße was built in 1950 and underwent complete modernization in 1994, now one of the city's most popular outdoor swimming attractions. The grounds cover roughly 10,500 m<sup>2</sup>, with approximately 750 m<sup>2</sup> in water area alone.

### Anthering Swimming Pool

This heated, beautifully maintained outdoor swimming pool close to the town center of Anthering provides cooling refreshment on hot summer days. The pool is open and looks forward to your visit in good weather between 9 am and 8 pm from May until the beginning of September.

### Waldbad Anif

This natural pool is a popular recreational oasis in the sunny south of Salzburg. Nestled between ancient trees, here you can experience nature in its most pristine form as you splash about in crystal-clear water. www.salzburg-umgebung.com

The Grünmarkt on Universitätsplatz (also in Wiener-Philharmoniker-Gasse on Saturday) is likewise a must-visit. The friendly atmosphere and wide selection of regional products make the Grünmarkt a popular gathering place for young and old.


## **Dining out**

On 1 July 1934, Casino Salzburg first opened its doors to players at Mirabell Palace. Since 1993, it has been housed within the walls of Schloss Klessheim.

Schloss Klessheim is a magnificent Baroque stately home located at the gates of Salzburg City, designed by famous architect Johann Bernhard Fischer von Erlach. His name as well as the Europe-wide impact of his genius add to the artistic importance of this architectural gem.

The juxtaposition of Baroque art and the modern gambling environment adds to the unique flair of this casino.

Since the beginning of 2016, after extensive renovations and adaptations, Casino Salzburg now presents itself in renewed glory. The renovated play areas and completely redesigned casino lounge with weekend casino and event bar on the ground floor, along with the expanded restaurant invite guests to while the hours away.
